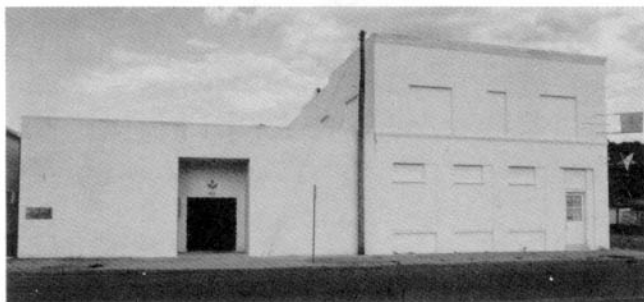


PALMETTO LODGE NUMBER 110, F.&A.M.



Palmetto Lodge No. 110 was chartered January 22, 1890 to meet at Palmetto in Manatee County.

The three Line Officers at chartering were:

W. B. Harrison — Worshipful Master
S. S. Lamb — Senior Warden
R. F. Willis — Junior Warden

The chartering Grand Lodge Officers were:

Henry William Long — Grand Master
Angus Paterson — Deputy Grand Master
Charles H. Munger — Senior Grand Warden
John F. Niblack — Junior Grand Warden
DeWitt C. Dawkins — Grand Secretary

Palmetto Lodge is named for the City of Palmetto. It is the only lodge to be assigned No. 110 and is still active and meets at Palmetto.

Palmetto Lodge No. 110 had (22) charter members who came from Manatee Lodge No. 31 of Florida, Meridian No. 168 of South Carolina, Albert Pike No. 363 of Tennessee, Pottsville No. 367 of Michigan and thirteen received their degrees in the Lodge U.D. The charter W.M. was from Meridian No. 168, the S.W. from Manatee No. 31 and the J.W. was from Albert Pike No. 363.

The Lodge Charter was burned June 19, 1904, and a certified copy was issued June 23, 1904.

Duplicate charter issued November 14, 1963.

Other than the charter line officers, the charter members were: Wm. H. Abel (367), Peter S. Harlee (31), F. M. Cooper (31), E. D. Mitchell (31), John J. Wimbish (31), R. D. Stanley (31), and the following received their degrees in the Lodge U.D. John Parish, J. A. Houze, J. A. Lamb, Rev. G. J. Kennelly, J. W. Nettles, J. K. Parish, R. T. Young, J. D. Richards, Geo. N. Brown, all Master Masons, G. W. Casen and J. S. Williams, both Fellowcrafts and M. C. Davis and Frank B. Turner, both Entered Apprentices.
